Hosted 46 State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) events reaching an audience of 1,996 and providing counseling to 2,262 clients.

Regional Ombudsman/Elder abuse Services program investigated 422 long-term care facility complaints, responded to 500 information/ referral requests, and participated in 51 surveys. National Council on Aging (NCOA) Benefits Outreach and Enrollment Center (BEC) was one of 20 national demonstration projects in FY 2011. GRADD's BEC hosted 95 events, screened 5,328 individuals and assisted with 5,227 enrollment applications for benefit programs (discovering an estimated \$5.2 million in resources available)

Family Caregiver Programs assisted 315 caregivers and 281 grandparents raising grandchildren. Information about caregiver programs was provided to 10,404 caregivers and 34,616 grandparents raising grandchildren.

### ***Community Outreach***

River Valley Behavioral Health clients are provided a 3-hour how to workshop focusing on resources at the Kentucky Career Center Green River Region, job searching, resume development, cover letters, applications, and interviewing--to date 185 individuals have been served.

Owensboro Regional Recovery clients are provided a 4-hour how to workshop focusing on resources at the Kentucky Career Center Green River Region, job searching, resume development, cover letters, applications, and interviewing—to date 97 individuals have been served.

GOALS clients are provided a 16-hour hands on workshop focusing on in-area and out-of-area area job searching, resources at a Kentucky Career Center, identifying barriers to employment, budgeting, resume development, cover letters, applications, and interviewing. Clients have a resume and cover letter to take with them when they get paroled—84 individuals have been served.

### ***Health Career Day***

On Thursday, May 12, 2011, “Bring the Best Back Home” was held at Ohio County Hospital and was a huge success. Students from Ohio County High School learned about opportunities in a hospital— all departments were represented to give tours to the students and explain the details of what is conducted on a daily basis. The life-flight helicopter was on the landing pad and students were able to get on and see what was inside. All of the students were there to witness a real-life emergency; a child had to be transported from Ohio County Hospital to Kosair’s Hospital in Louisville.

***Prescription for Success Healthcare Initiative- Green River Nursing Rx***

In April of 2010 Governor Steve Beshear awarded \$250,000 to the Green River Workforce Investment Board to develop job training programs for careers in health care occupations. This grant ended June 30, 2011. The GR-WIB used these funds to implement programs to specifically serve low-income, unemployed, underemployed adults, veterans and spouses of veterans who were interested in an education or training program leading to a career in the health care sector. Participants received placements in the following targeted sectors: Certified Nurse Aide, Medication Aide, Medical Office Clinical Assistant and Medical Coding Specialist. There were a total of 79 people served, 47 students served in CNA, 14 served in Medical Office Clinical, and 18 served Medical Coding Specialist. To date 37 of 79 students have been placed into unsubsidized and subsidized employment.

***Green River Internship Program***

The Green River Internship Program was designed to give adults and dislocated workers and opportunity to explore and develop employability, professional, occupational and transferable skills. The program focused on high demand sector job placements, with a potential for the placements to lead to full time employment. The internships lasted for up to 500 hours and the participants were paid an entry level wage relative to their specific position for the duration of the internship. Participants received placements in the following targeted sectors: Health Care, Advanced Manufacturing, Science, Technology, Engineering, Math, Information Technology and Energy. There were a total of 15 people placed, and three people were hired on full time after the internship was completed. Several participants are continuing their education in their respective field of interest, and plan to combine their classroom knowledge with the on the job training they acquired during their internship.
